Core Values

Community

At FCWC, we value community. In the early days of the church, community was synonymous with unity. They looked toward the needs of others and people were attracted to Christ. **Acts 2:42-47 Acts 4:32-35**

With the idea of community come the ideas of service and humility. Our task is to show people, who would normally not encounter Him, Jesus. We do this by considering others better than ourselves and serving. In reading the Great Commission, we would focus on the word, "Go."

Philippians 2:33; James 3:13

We celebrate the diversity that God has created in his people. We would also celebrate the diversity of the Church, but in order to lead with wisdom, we need to focus not on the diversity but the unity. What do we have in common?

We model the ideas of community by the way we worship together, stay in the same building to sleep, eat, pray and lead together. We are interdenominational. We seek to elevate others and are more concerned about the homeowners than about the conditions in which we serve.

Ministry

Jesus

We desire that the city would see Jesus and realize the freedom He gives. We want to be an example of what Christ was like while He was among us. We want to be "Jesus in skin"

Isaiah 61:1 *The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, 2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, 3 and provide for those who grieve in Zion-- to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor. 4 They will rebuild the ancient ruins and restore the places long devastated; they will renew the ruined cities that have been devastated for generations*

Discipleship

Matthew 17:1-8

Transfigurational Discipleship must happen within the week of Flower City Work Camp through intense unveiling and revealing of Christ. Students are brought into the purest form of the presence of Christ. The shining face of Christ and the holiness and purity of Jesus. Transfigurational Discipleship will then lead to Transformational Discipleship.

Students come to FCWC and experience Jesus in a transfigurational way, "It is good to be here, enveloped by a cloud, voice of God is heard, falling face down, no fear, and seeing only Jesus." Then ideally after coming down from the mountain experience, the transformational discipleship that happens until the day of resurrection (v9) or in our terms the return of Christ.

FCWC values Transformational Discipleship - A passionate, enveloping, engaging time with Jesus that causes long term changes of humility and focus in the mind, body, and spirit for daily Christian Living.

The Local Church

Ephesians 4:3-6 Flower City Work Camp strives to demonstrate the unity, love and power of the Rochester body of Christ.

Ephesians 4:11-16. Flower City Work Camp is designed to incorporate people from across the participating local churches. A church cannot simply send their youth. Cross-generational ministry is the best way to build up the local church bodies.
