SITE LEADER & ROVING EXPERT; SIDEWALK & BASKETBALL CAMP LEADER AND MOTHERS OF SIDEWALKERS INFORMATION

Flower City Work Camp operates on the strength and commitment of the churches and volunteers who give of their time and energy to serve our City and enable teens to also serve God in practical ways. Site, Sidewalk and Basketball Camp Leaders are at the heart of what Work Camp does, as they lead and mentor the participating teens and serve as a Godly example to the homes and neighborhoods in which they serve.

If you are interested in serving in one of these ways at Work Camp you should:

1. Believe in Jesus Christ as your personal Savior.
2. Be past high school age.
3. Be an active attender at a participating church.
4. Fill out and submit an application no later than the December 31 deadline.

SITE LEADERS & ROVING EXPERTS

Site Leaders are a key part of Work Camp; each church is expected to provide one Work Site Leader for each four students the church plans to send to Work Camp. These leaders provide planning, direction and support on Work Sites, while enabling participating students to do the ministry work.

If you are interested in serving as a Site Leader you will be expected to:

1. Attend Flower City Work Camp **April 19 - 23, 2010**. This involves:
 - Meeting your team and attending the leader's meeting on Monday evening.
 - Serving as a Work Site Leader from Tuesday through Thursday. Leaders should be at the church by 7:30 a.m. and return their team to the church by 4:30 p.m.
2. Attend one of two informational meetings scheduled for **February 2010**. Work Site Leader teams and Work Sites will be assigned at this time.
3. Be willing to work with teenagers and enable the students to do the work, rather than doing the work yourself. You will be given a list of students. Please call the students in advance to welcome them to your team and let them know what tools they should bring.
4. Visit your assigned Work Site to review the work needed, plan the work and submit a list of needed materials **by March 1, 2010**.
5. Shop for small items not in our inventory before **April 19, 2010**.
6. Arrange for your crew to have the tools they need.

You do not need to be an expert in building or home repair. Any work experience and skill is valuable, but we will do our best to team Work Site Leaders with complementary skills and match them to the Work Site tasks. We will also provide expert resources as consultants whenever needed.

Roving Experts are adults skilled in one or more major home repair areas: electrical, plumbing, carpentry, masonry, roofing, etc. Roving Experts are not assigned a particular work site, but are available during Work Camp (April 20-22 in particular) to assist Site Leaders with labor-intensive, skill-specific projects or consultations. Roving Experts may also be called on prior to Work Camp as Site Leaders plan the work to be done on their site.

SIDEWALK CLUB LEADERS

Sidewalk Clubs are a mini-Vacation Bible School type ministry that operates alongside Work Sites in City neighborhoods. Sidewalk Club teams evangelize children with Bible stories, verses, songs, crafts and a clear presentation of the Gospel during the three working days of Work Camp.

A Sidewalk Club Leader functions in much the same way for the Sidewalk Clubs as the Work Site Leader does for the Work Site. He or she needs to provide planning, direction and support while allowing the students to do the ministry work.

If you are interested in serving as a Sidewalk Club Leader you:

1. Should have experience working with young children as well as feel comfortable working with teenagers
2. Must commit to meet for training prior to Camp
3. Will need to assist with Sidewalk Club preparation prior to Camp
4. Must contact your Sidewalk Club team prior to Camp
5. Must commit to participate in Camp on Monday afternoon, April 19, and on Tuesday through Thursday (April 20 - 22) during the day.

MOTHERS OF SIDEWALKERS LEADERS

A Mothers of Sidewalkers Leader works alongside Sidewalk Clubs by ministering to the moms, dads and grandparents of the children attending a neighborhood Sidewalk Club. MOS Leaders are available to lead Bible studies, pray, and begin to build relationships with Sidewalk Clubber families.

If you are interested in serving as a Mothers of Sidewalkers Leader, you must be willing to plan and lead short Bible studies and relationship-building times with inner-City adults.

Note that MOS Leaders do not count toward the 1:4 leader:student ratio.

BASKETBALL CAMP COACHES

A Basketball Camp Coach functions in much the same way for the Basketball Camp as the Work Site Leader does for the Work Site. The Coach works with Work Camp teens to help lead basketball skills and scrimmage events at a City-based mini-camp. The Coach needs to provide planning, direction and support, while allowing the students to do the ministry work.

If you are interested in serving as a Basketball Camp Coach you:

1. Should have experience working with young children as well as feel comfortable working with teenagers
2. Must commit to meet for training prior to Camp
3. Will need to assist with Basketball Camp preparation prior to Camp
4. Must contact your Basketball Camp team prior to Camp
5. Must commit to participate in Camp on Monday afternoon, April 19, and on Tuesday through Thursday (April 20 – 22) during the day.
